Sunset occurs when upper limb of Sun disappears. Sun is already 1 solar disk below horizon.

Months are based on the 1st Crescent of the Moon in Jerusalem.

Dates **begin in evening**. "Evening and morning were the 1st day." Genesis 1:5

Shavuot would be erev Shavuot, Yom Kippur would be erev Yom Kippur etcetera.

The true biblical first day of the month is when the first crescent of the Moon reappears.

Date is best chance based on the reappearance of the Moon from TimeandDate.com

Jewish calendars are set calendars and are not based on when the Moon reappears.

50 day count to Shavuot begins the day after the Sabbath rest of the 1st day of Unleavened Bread.

The count begins on the day of First Fruits, the 1st day of the Omer.

The Sun is absolutely set when it disappears. 3 stars is advisable when we cannot see the sunset.
